



## CALL FOR PAPERS 2009 AIS EDUCATOR CONFERENCE

The 11th Annual AIS Educator Conference will be held June 26-28, 2009, in Colorado Springs, Colorado. The conference invites scholarship from both a teaching and research perspective. Research at early stages of development is welcome. Appropriate submissions include extended abstracts (proposals), working papers (unpublished cases or empirical research), teaching presentations, and panel discussion proposals. In the area of AIS teaching, potential topics include, but are not limited to innovative assignments, cases, or projects about emerging IT concepts and/or tools in AIS.

In the area of AIS research, topics include but are not limited to AIS educational research, control and auditing systems, database systems, enterprise systems, e-commerce, expert systems, artificial intelligence, decision aids, knowledge management, financial reporting systems, general AIS frameworks, Internet systems, organization and management of IS, systems implementation issues, REA, and XBRL.

Educators can also submit proposals for presentations and panel discussions. Presentations are appropriate for both hands-on computer and other training that require 60 minutes or more to present properly. Panel discussions can address any AIS topic and may include both educators and practitioners.

### THE DEADLINE FOR SUBMISSIONS IS MARCH 1, 2009.

Acceptance notifications will be made by April 30, 2009. Registration for the conference is required to be a presenter or session moderator.

#### **Document Preparation**

The paper should follow the submission style guidelines available on the AIS Educator Association's web site. Select the [Conference Info](#) and [Submissions](#) links to access these guidelines. *Remove all identifiers of the author and school from the document.*

#### **Electronic Submission**

Papers should be submitted through the AIS Educator Association's web site, selecting the [Conference Info](#), [Submission](#), and [Manage My Submissions Online](#) links. Use a file name that reflects the name of the paper rather than the author. In the Submission Type box, select the appropriate description of your submission:

- Completed Paper
- Extended Abstract
- Presentation Proposal
- Panel Discussion

### **Best Paper Award**

The best papers from the initial review will be nominated for a best paper competition. An independent panel of judges will perform a second review of the nominated papers to determine the award winner. The award will be announced at a conference luncheon.

### **Student Paper Competition**

The Student Paper Competition is intended to recognize outstanding work by graduate students of accounting information systems. The student who submits the winning paper will receive a \$1,000 cash award upon attending the AIS Educator Conference and presenting the paper. Paper topics may include but are not limited to: AIS educational research, control and auditing systems, database systems, enterprise systems, E-commerce, expert systems, artificial intelligence, decision aids, knowledge management, financial reporting systems, general AIS frameworks, Internet systems, organization and management of IS, systems implementation issues, REA, and XBRL.

**THE DEADLINE FOR SUBMISSIONS IS MARCH 1, 2009.** The paper will be subjected to a blind review process. Notification to participating students will be made by April 15, 2009. ### **Jack and Maye Stewart Student Project Competition**

This competition is intended to recognize outstanding work by students on Accounting Information Systems class projects and cases. Educators are encouraged to submit, with the permission of the student(s) involved, outstanding student work on projects or cases. The work may be completed by an individual or by a group and is open to either undergraduate or graduate level students.

Awards will be presented as follows:

- Students with the top three projects will receive \$100 per project.
- The educator of each of the top three projects is invited to attend the conference to present their winning course materials, project or case. Each educator attending the conference will receive a \$250 award.

**THE DEADLINE FOR SUBMISSIONS IS MAY 1, 2009.** The project will be subjected to a blind review process. Notification to participating educators will be made by May 30, 2009.
